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Note:

This is a shared user manual for 4013X/4013D specifying Dual SIM information where relevant.

Your phone only supports Normal SIM card. Do not attempt to insert other SIM card types like micro and nano card, otherwise you may damage your phone. If your phone experiences an unexpected system crash, try to press and hold the **Power** key for a while until the power-on animation appears.

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This product meets applicable national SAR limits of 2.0W/kg. The specific maximum SAR values can be found on page 7 of this user guide.

When carrying the product or using it while worn on your body, either use an approved accessory such as a holster or otherwise maintain a distance of 10 mm from the body to ensure compliance with RF exposure requirements. Note that the product may be transmitting even if you are not making a phone call.

Safety and use.....

We recommend that you read this chapter carefully before using your phone. The manufacturer disclaims any liability for damage, which may result as a consequence of improper use or use contrary to the instructions contained herein.

• TRAFFIC SAFETY:

Given that studies show that using a mobile phone while driving a vehicle constitutes a real risk, even when the hands-free kit is used (car kit, headset...), drivers are requested to refrain from using their mobile when the vehicle is not parked.

When driving, do not use your phone and headphone to listen to music or to the radio. Using a headphone can be dangerous and forbidden in some areas.

When switched on, your phone emits electromagnetic waves that can interfere with the vehicle's electronic systems such as ABS anti-lock brakes or airbags. To ensure that there is no problem:

- do not place your phone on top of the dashboard or within an airbag deployment area,

- check with your car dealer or the car manufacturer to make sure that the dashboard is adequately shielded from mobile phone RF energy.

CONDITIONS OF USE:

You are advised to switch off the telephone from time to time to optimise its performance.

Switch the phone off before boarding an aircraft.

Switch the phone off when you are in health care facilities, except in designated areas. As with many other types of equipment now in regular use, mobile telephones can interfere with other electrical or electronic devices, or equipment using radio frequency.

Switch the phone off when you are near gas or flammable liquids. Strictly obey all signs and instructions posted in a fuel depot, petrol station, or chemical plant, or in any potentially explosive atmosphere.

When the phone is switched on, it should be kept at least 15 cm from any medical device such as a pacemaker, a hearing aid or insulin pump, etc. In particular when using the phone, you should hold it against the ear on the opposite side to the device, if any. To avoid hearing impairment, pick up the call before holding your phone to your ear. Also move the handset away from your ear while using the "hands-free" mode because the amplified volume might cause hearing damage.

Do not let children use the phone and/or play with the telephone and accessories without supervision.

When replacing the cover please note that your phone may contain substances that could create an allergic reaction.

Always handle your phone with care and keep it in a clean and dust-free place.

Do not allow your phone to be exposed to adverse weather or environmental conditions (moisture, humidity, rain, infiltration of liquids, dust, sea air, etc). The manufacturer's recommended operating temperature range is -10° C to $+55^{\circ}$ C.

At over 55° C the legibility of the phone's display may be impaired, though this is temporary and not serious.

Your mobile device is a radio transmitter and receiver. The guidelines were developed by an independent scientific organisation (ICNIRP) and include a substantial safety margin designed to assure the safety of all persons, regardless of age and health.

The radio wave exposure guidelines use a unit of measurement known as the Specific Absorption Rate, or SAR. The SAR limit for mobile devices is 2 W/kg.

During use, the actual SAR values for this device are usually well below the values stated above. This is because, for purposes of system efficiency and to minimize interference on the network, the operating power of your mobile device is automatically decreased when full power is not needed for the call. The lower the power output of the device, the lower its SAR value.

Body-worn SAR testing has been carried out at a separation distance of 10 mm. To meet RF exposure guidelines during body-worn operation, the device should be positioned at least this distance away from the body. If you are not using an approved accessory ensure that whatever product is used is free of any metal and that it positions the phone the indicated distance away from the body. Organisations such as the World Health Organisation and the US Food and Drug Administration have statesd that if people are concerned and want to reduce their exposure they could use a hands-free device to keep the phone away from the head and body during phone calls, or reduce the amount of time spent on the phone.



Menu key

- Option menu. Touch to access Manage Home screen, Add widgets, Manage applications, Wallpaper and Settings.
- Recent apps. Touch and hold to open a list of thumbnail images of apps you've worked with recently. Touch it to open an app. Swipe it upwards or downwards to remove a thumbnail from the list.

Home key

• While on any application or screen, touch to return to the Home screen.

Back key

• Touch to go back to the previous screen, or to close a dialog box, options menu, the Notification panel, etc.

Power key

- Press: Lock the screen/Light up the screen.
- Press and hold: Power on or generate a popup menu selecting from Power off/Restart/Aeroplane mode or icons of Ringer mode.
- Press to mute the ringtone when there's an incoming call.
- Press and hold for more than 7 seconds to restart the phone if the system has frozen.
- Press and hold the **Power** and **Volume down** keys to capture a screenshot.
- Press and hold the **Power** and **Volume up** keys in power off mode to restore factory settings.

Volume keys

- In call mode, adjusts the earpiece or headset volume.
- In Music/Video/Streaming mode, adjust the media volume.
- In general mode, adjust the ring tone volume.
- Mutes the ringtone of an incoming call.
- Press to light up the screen when it dims during a call.
- In Camera mode using it as the capture key allows you to take a photo.


I.2.I Setup

Removing or installing the back cover



Inserting or removing the SIM card

You must insert your SIM card to make phone calls. Power off your phone before inserting or removing the SIM card.



Place the SIM card with the chip facing downwards and slide it into its housing. Make sure that it is correctly inserted. To remove the card, press and slide it out.

For dual SIM models, both SIMI and SIM2 can support 2G and 3G networks, but when 3G SIM cards are inserted into both SIMI and SIM2 slot at the same time, only one SIM card will support 3G network $^{\rm (I)}.$



Your phone only support mini-SIM card. Do not attempt to insert other SIM type like micro and nano card, otherwise may cause phone damage.

Installing or removing the battery

Power off your phone before removing the battery.



• Insert and click the battery into place, then close the cover.

• Unclip the cover, then remove the battery.

Installing or removing the microSD card



To install, insert the external microSD card into the slot with the gold contact facing down. To remove the external microSD card, gently press and slide it out.

Charging the battery



Connect the battery charger to your phone and mains socket respectively.

- Make sure the battery is correctly inserted before connecting the charger.
- When using your telephone for the first time, charge the battery fully (approximately 5 hours).

You are advised to fully charge the battery (1). The charge status is indicated by an on-screen percentage reading while the phone is powered off. The percentage increases as the phone is charged.

If the battery is very low, there will be no indication that power is being received until the charge is sufficient to show the charging status bar. To reduce power consumption and energy waste, once the battery is fully charged, disconnect your charger from the plug; switch off Wi-Fi, GPS, Bluetooth or background-running applications when not in use; reduce the backlight time, etc.

1.2.2 Power on your phone

Hold down the **Power** key until the phone powers on, unlock your phone (Slide, PIN, Password or Pattern) if necessary and confirm. The Home screen will then be displayed.

If you do not know your PIN code or if you forgot it, contact your network operator. Do not leave your PIN code with your phone. Store this information in a safe place when not in use.

Set up your phone for the first time

Once you have powered on your phone for the first time, you should set the following options:

- Select the phone's language, then touch Get started.
- Select the font size from Small, Normal or Large.
- Select your input keyboard, then touch
- Select a Wi-Fi to connect, then touch
- Select a SIM card or choose Always ask for voice call, messaging, etc. (1)
- Set up your Google account: Touch Set up now. If you have a Google account, touch Existing to sign in, then enter your username and password. If you forgot your password, you can go to http://www.google. com/ to retrieve it. If you don't own a Google account, you are prompted to create one by touching New. Touch to skip to the next step.
- Activate and select your location mode (High accuracy/Battery saving/ Device only), then touch .
- Set your **Backup & reset** preferences.
- Touch then the setup complete screen displays, touch **Enjoy now** to confirm.


If you power on your phone with no SIM card inserted, you can connect to a Wi-Fi network to sign into your Google account and use some features.

1.2.3 Power off your phone

Hold down the Power key from the Home screen, select Power off.

I.3 Home screen

You can bring all the items (applications, shortcuts, folders and widgets) you love or use most frequently to your Home screen for quick access. Touch the **Home** key to switch to the Home screen.



The Home screen is provided in an extended format to allow more space for adding applications, shortcuts etc. Slide the Home screen horizontally left and right to get a complete view of the Home screen. The white short line at the lower part of the screen indicates which screen you are viewing.

1.3.1 Using the touchscreen

Touch

To access an application, touch it with your finger.

Touch and Hold



Touch and hold the Home screen to access the available options for setting the Home screens.

Drag £

Place your finger on any item to drag it to another location.

Slide/Swipe

Slide the screen to scroll up and down the applications, images, web pages... at your convenience.

Flick

Similar to swiping, but flicking makes it move quicker.

Pinch/Spread

Place the fingers of one hand on the screen surface and draw them apart or together to scale an element on the screen.



Automatically change the screen orientation from portrait to landscape by turning the phone sideways to have a better view.

I.3.2 Status bar

From the Status bar, you can view both phone status (on the right side) and notification information (on the left side).



Notification panel

Touch and drag down the Status bar to open the Notification panel. Touch and drag up to close it. From the Notification panel, you can open items and other reminders indicated by notification icons or view wireless service information.



Touch one notification and slide it sideways to delete it.

Touch $\stackrel{\text{\tiny def}}{\underset{\text{\tiny def}}{\Rightarrow}}$ and then the Settings icon O to access **Settings**.



Quick settings bar

• Touch the icons to enable/disable functions or to change modes

1.3.3 Lock/Unlock your screen

To protect your phone and privacy, you can lock the phone screen by creating a variety of patterns, PIN or password.

To create a screen unlock pattern (refer to section "Screen lock" for detailed settings)

- Draw your own pattern.



To create a screen unlock PIN/Password

- Touch Settings\Lock settings\Select screen lock\PIN or Password.
- Set your PIN or password.

To lock phone screen

Press the **Power** key once to lock the screen.

To unlock phone screen

Press the **Power** key once to light up the screen, draw the unlock pattern you have created or enter your PIN or password to unlock the screen.

If you have chosen **Slide** as the screen lock, slide the screen right to unlock the screen.



1.3.4 Personalise your Home screen

Add

Touch the Application tab ${\rm IIIII}$, touch and hold an application to activate Move mode, and drag the item to your preferred Home screen.

While adding an application to a Home screen, drag it to the top of the **App info** icon to view its detailed information. If the application is already downloaded, drag it to the top of the **Uninstall** icon to uninstall it directly.

Reposition

Touch and hold the item to be repositioned to activate Move mode, drag the item to the desired position and then release. You can move items both on the Home screen and the Favourite tray. Hold the icon on the left or right edge of the screen to drag the item to another Home screen.

Remove

Touch and hold the item to be removed to activate Move mode, drag the item up to the top of the \mathbf{Remove} icon, and release after the item turns red.

Create folders

To improve the organisation of items (shortcuts or applications) on the Home screen and the Favourite tray, you can add them to a folder by stacking one item on top of another. To rename a folder, open it, touch the folder's title bar and input the new name.

Wallpaper customisation

Touch the Menu key and select **Wallpaper**. A popup window named **Select wallpaper from** will appear, offering a range of options. **Gallery** includes pictures you have taken, cropped or downloaded. **Live wallpapers** includes a scrolling list of animated wallpapers. **Video wallpaper** includes preset videos in the phone; and videos stored in your SD card and camera. **Homescreen wallpapers** includes all preset wallpapers in the phone. Slide left and right to locate a desired image, touch **Set wallpaper** to confirm.

1.3.5 Application tab

Touch iiii on the Home screen to enter the applications. To return to the Home screen, touch the **Home** key.

Consult recently-used applications

To consult recently-used applications, you can touch and hold the **Menu** key. Touch a thumbnail in the window to open the related application. Touch one thumbnail and slide it upwards or downwards to delete it. You can also touch and hold the app and touch **Remove from list** to delete it.



1.3.6 Volume adjustment

Using the Volume key

Press the **Volume** key to adjust the volume. To activate vibrate mode, press the **Volume down** key until the phone vibrates. Press the **Volume down** key once more to activate silent mode.

Using Settings menu

Drag down the Notification panel and touch $\stackrel{\text{\tiny def}}{\underset{\text{\tiny const}}{}}$ and then the Settings icon $\stackrel{\text{\scriptsize const}}{\underset{\text{\scriptsize const}}{}}$ to enter **Settings**, then touch **Sound**. You can set the volumes of ringtones, notifications, system sounds etc. according to your preference.

This list contains all pre-embedded and newly installed applications.

To access the list, touch iiii from the Home screen.

To return to the Home screen, touch the Home key or the Back key.

Slide left and right to view all applications. Touch **ALL APPS** or **DOWNLOADED** to access the category directly.

2.1 Using the Onscreen Keyboard


Onscreen Keyboard settings

Touch the Application tab from the Home screen, select **Settings Language & input**, touch the Settings icon 🖗 on the right of **Android keyboard** or **SwiftKey**. Settings are available for your selection from the displayed series.

Adjust the Onscreen Keyboard orientation

Turn the phone sideways or upright to adjust the Onscreen Keyboard orientation. You can also adjust it by changing the settings (on the application list, touch **Settings\Display\Auto-rotate screen)**.



2.2 Text editing

- The following options will appear: Select all . , Cut 🔀 , Copy 📄 and Paste 🗐.
- Touch the icon \checkmark to confirm.

You can also insert new text

- Touch where you want to type, or touch and hold a blank space, the cursor will blink and the tabs will show. Drag the tab to move the cursor.
- If you have selected any text, touch the tab to show **PASTE** icon which allows you to paste any text you have previously copied.




3 Phone call, Call log and Contacts

3. Phone **C**

3.1.1 Placing a call

The user can easily start a call using the **Phone** application. Touch the Application tab from the Home screen and select **Phone**.



Enter the desired number from the keyboard directly or select a contact from **People** or **Call log** by sliding or touching tabs, then touch ζ_{\bullet} to place the call.

The number you entered can be saved to **People** by touching and selecting **Add to contacts**.

If you make a mistake, you can delete the incorrect digits by touching $\langle x \rangle$.

To hang up a call, touch 🔼

International call

To dial an international call, touch and hold $^0_+$ to enter "+", then enter the international country prefix followed by the full phone number and finally touch \mathbb{Q}_{\bullet} .

Emergency call

If your phone has network coverage, dial the emergency number and touch to make an emergency call. This works even without a SIM card and without typing the PIN code.



When making a call with two SIM cards installed, a dialog box will pop up for you to choose the preferred SIM card. The system will choose the default one if the countdown time is over.⁽¹⁾

3.1.2 Answering or rejecting a call



When you receive a call, touch 🔘

- Slide to the right to answer;
- Slide to the left to reject;
- Slide upwards to reject the call by sending a preset message.

To mute the ringtone volume of an incoming call, press the $\ensuremath{\textit{Volume up}}\xspace$ down key.

3.1.3 Calling your voicemail

Your voicemail is provided by your network to avoid missing calls. It works like an answering machine that you can consult at any time.

To access your voicemail, touch and hold 1 on the **Phone** tab.

To set your voicemail number, touch and touch **Settings\Voice call** Voicemail.

If you receive a voicemail, a voicemail icon $\mathbf{Q}\mathbf{O}$ appears on the Status bar. Open the Notification panel and touch **New Voicemail** to hear it.

3.1.4 During a call

To adjust the volume during a call, press the Volume up/down key.

Touch to hold the current call. Touch this icon again to retrieve the call.

Touch to display dial pad.

- Touch to end the current call.
- Touch to mute the current call. Touch this icon again to unmute the call.

Touch to activate the speaker during the current call. Touch this icon again to deactivate the speaker.

Touch and select Start recording to record.

To avoid accidental touchscreen operations during a call, the screen will be locked automatically when you put the cellphone close to your ear; it will be unlocked when the cellphone is taken away from your ear.

3.1.5 Managing multiple calls

With this phone you can handle multiple calls at the same time.

Swap calls

When you accept two calls, you can now switch between two lines. The current call is put on hold and you can join the other call.

Conference calls⁽¹⁾

To set up a conference call:

- Place a call to the first participant of the conference call.
- Touch and select Add call.
- Enter the phone number of the person you want to add to the conference and touch **Call**.You can also add participants from **People** or **Call log**.
- Touch the <u></u>icon to start a conference call.
- During a conference call, touch to drop a participant or to talk privately to one of the participants. Touch a to drop the participant from the conference, touch to talk privately to the participant and hold the other participants.
- Touch and the conference call and disconnect all callers.

3.1.6 Call settings

Touch $\ensuremath{\mathring{}}$ and select Settings from the Dial screen. The following options are available:

Voice call

• Voicemail

Service	Opens a dialog box where you can select your operator's voicemail service or another service.
Voicemail settings	If you are using your operator's voicemail service, this opens a dialog box where you can enter the phone number to use for listening to and managing your voicemail.You can enter a comma (,) to insert a pause into the number — for example, to add a password after the phone number.

Touch to configure how your calls are forwarded when you are busy, unanswered or unreachable.

• Call barring

You can activate or deactivate call barring for outgoing and incoming calls. The various options are:

• Fixed Dialling Numbers

Fixed Dialling Number (FDN) is a SIM service mode, where outgoing calls are restricted to a set of phone numbers. These numbers are added to the FDN list. The most common practical application of FDN is for parents to restrict the phone numbers which their children can dial.

For security reasons, you'll be prompted to enable FDN by entering SIM PIN2 which is usually acquired from your service provider or SIM maker.

• Minute reminder

Mark the checkbox to enable minute reminder at 50s of every minute during a call.

Quick responses

Touch to edit quick responses which will be used when you reject a call with messages.

• International dialling assist

Mark the checkbox to activate.

3.2 Call log

You can access your call memory by touching (-) from the Dial screen. Touch & on the right side of the contact/number to place a call directly. There are three kinds of calls in Call log:

Touch a contact or number to view information or further operations.

You can view detailed information of a call, launch a new call or send a messages to a contact or number, or add numbers to People (only available for unsaved phone numbers), etc.

Touch the contact's photo to open the Quick Contact panel.

To clear the entire call memory, touch \Box and **Delete**.


3.3 People.....

The People app enables quick and easy access to the people you want to reach.

You can view and create contacts on your phone and synchronise these with your Gmail contacts or other applications on the web or on your phone.

3.3.1 **Consult your contacts**

To access the **People** app, touch the Application tab on the Home screen, then select **People**.



Touch 🗌 to display contacts list option menu.

The following actions are enabled:

- **Delete contact** Select and delete unwanted contacts.
- · Contacts to display Choose contacts to display.
- Import/export Import or export contacts between phone, SIM card, and microSD card, or share contacts.
- Accounts Manage the synchronisation settings for different accounts.
- Settings Access contact display settings.
- Share visible Share contacts with others by sending the contacts contact's vCard to them via Bluetooth, Email, SMS, etc.

3.3.2 Managing contact groups

The contact group helps you to improve the organisation of your contacts. You can add, remove and view groups in the **Contact group** screen.

Touch the $\textcircled{}{}$ icon to view local groups. To create a new group, touch the $\textcircled{}{}$ icon, enter the new name and touch **DONE** to confirm. If you have added accounts to your phone, touch the $\textcircled{}{}$ icon to view groups in accounts.

3.3.3 Adding a contact

Touch the \underline{R} icon in the contact list to create a new contact.

You are required to enter the contact's name and other contact information. By scrolling up and down the screen, you can move from one field to another easily.



If you want to add more information, touch $\mbox{\bf Add}$ another field to add a new category.

When finished, touch **DONE** to save.

To exit without saving, you can touch \Box and **Discard**.

Add to/remove from Favourites

To add a contact to favourites, you can touch a contact to view details then touch $\frac{1}{2}$ to add the contact to favourites.

To remove a contact from favourites, touch 🜟 on contact details screen.



Only phone contacts can be added to favourites.

3.3.4 Editing your contacts

To edit contact information, touch \square in the contact details screen, then touch **Edit.** When finished, touch **DONE**.

Change a contact's default phone number

The default phone number (the number which has priority when making a call or sending a message) will always be displayed under the contact name.

To change the default phone number, touch and hold the number you want to set as the default number from the contact's details screen, then select **Set default**. A \checkmark appears after the number.

This choice is only available when the contact has more than one number.

Delete a contact

To delete a contact, touch \square and touch Delete from the contact (details) screen.

On the contacts list screen, touch \square and then **Delete contact**, select the contact(s) you want to remove and touch \checkmark to confirm. Touch **Select all** and then \checkmark to delete all contacts.



The contact you have deleted will also be removed from other applications on the phone or web the next time you synchronise your phone.

3.3.5 Communicating with your contacts

From the contacts details screen, you can communicate with your contacts by making a call or exchanging messages.

To launch a call, touch the % icon on the right side of the number.

To send a message, touch the icon on the right side of the number.

Use Quick contact for Android

Touch a contact's picture to open Quick Contact for Android, then you can touch the number or the \bigoplus icon for the way you want to connect.



The icons available on the Quick Contact panel depend on the information you have for the contact and the applications/accounts on your phone.

3.3.6 Contacts importing, exporting and sharing

This phone enables you to import contacts from a SIM card/microSD card and export contacts to a microSD card which can then be used to back up your information.

From the Contacts screen, touch \Box to open the options menu, touch **Import/export**, then choose to import/export contacts from/to SIM card, Phone, SD card, Phone storage, Accounts, etc.

To import/export a single contact from/to a SIM card, choose an account and target SIM card(s), select the contact you want to import/export, and touch \checkmark to confirm.

To import/export all contacts from/to a SIM card, choose an account and target SIM card(s), touch **Select all** and touch \checkmark to confirm.

You can share a single contact or contacts with others by sending the contact's vCard to them via Bluetooth, Gmail, etc.

Touch a contact you want to share, touch \Box and **Share** from the contact details screen, then select the application to perform this action.

3.3.7 Displaying contacts

You can configure which group of contacts, for each account, you want to display in the Contacts list. Touch \square and then **Contacts to display** from the contacts list screen, then you can choose which contacts to display.

By touching \Box and then **Settings**, you can **Sort list by** Given name or Family name, as well as **View contact names as** Given name first or Family name first.

3.3.8 Joining contacts

To avoid duplication, you can add any new contact information to existing contacts in a single action.

Touch the contact which you want to add information to, touch \square and then **Edit**, then touch \square in the edit screen and touch **Join**.

Then, you will be required to select the contact whose information you want to join with the first contact. The information from the second contact is added to the first one, and the second contact will no longer be displayed in the Contacts list.

3.3.9 Synchronising contacts in multiple accounts

Contacts, data or other information can be synchronised from multiple accounts, depending on the applications installed on your phone.

To add an account, touch O on the Quick settings bar to get to **Settings**, then touch **Add account**.

You are required to select the kind of account you are adding, like Google, Corporate, etc.

As with other account setups, you need to enter detailed information, like username, password, etc.

You can remove an account and all associated information from the phone. Open the **Settings** screen, touch the account you want to delete, touch \Box and then select **Remove account**, then confirm.

Sync

You can synchronise an account on the **Accounts** screen. Touch an account in the list, then touch \square and select **Sync now**.

4.1 Messaging.....

Your phone can create, edit and receive SMS and MMS messages.

Go to the Home page and touch the Messaging $\hfill \hfill \hfil$

4.1.1 Writing a message

On the message list screen, touch the new message icon to write text/ multimedia messages.



- • Touch to view the whole message thread
- Touch and hold message threads to delete thread or to add shortcut





For saved contacts, touch the photo to open the **Quick Contact** panel to communicate with the contact. For unsaved contacts, touch the photo to add the number to your **People.**

Sending a text message

Enter the mobile phone number of the recipient on the **Type person's name or number** bar or touch $\underline{\alpha}$ to add recipients, touch the **Type text message** bar to enter the text of the message. When finished, touch \geq to send the text message. You have to choose a SIM card if two cards are inserted.⁽¹⁾

An SMS of more than 160 characters will be charged as several SMS. Specific (accented) letters will increase the size of the SMS, which may cause multiple SMS to be sent to your recipient.

Sending a multimedia message

MMS enables you to send video clips, images, photos, animations, slides , sounds, contact and calendar to other compatible mobiles and e-mail addresses.

An SMS will be converted to MMS automatically when media files (image, video, audio, slides, etc.) are attached or subject or email addresses are added.

To send a multimedia message, enter the recipient's phone number in the **Type person's name or number** bar, touch the **Type text message** bar to enter the text of the message. Touch \Box to open the option menu, touch **Add subject** to insert a subject, and touch \bigoplus to attach a picture, video, audio and so on.


When finished, touch \triangleright to send the multimedia message.

4.1.2 Manage messages

When a new message comes, a \equiv icon will appear on the Status bar as notification. Drag down the Status bar to open the Notification panel, touch the new message to open it. You can also access **Messaging** and touch the new message to open it.

Messages are displayed in conversational order.

To reply to a message, touch the current message to enter the message composing screen, enter the text, then touch \triangleright .

Touch and hold a message in the message details screen, the following options will be available:

- Copy This option is only available for SMS.Touch to copy current message content and paste it to the Type text message bar of the new message you are going to compose.
- Forward Touch to forward the message to another recipient.
- **Delete message** Delete the current message.

4.2 Gmail/Email

The first time you set up your phone, you can select to use an existing Gmail account or to create a new Email account.

4.2.1 Gmail

As Google's web-based email service, Gmail is configured when you first set up your phone. Gmail on your phone can be automatically synchronised with your Gmail account on the web. Unlike other kinds of email account, each message and its replies in Gmail are grouped in your inbox as a single conversation; all emails are organised by labels instead of folders.

To access Gmail

From the Home screen, touch the Application tab to enter the applications list, then touch **Gmail**.

Gmail displays messages and conversations from one single Gmail account at a time, if you own more than one account, you can add an account by touching and selecting **Settings** from the Inbox screen, then touch **ADD ACCOUNT**. When finished, you can switch to another by touching the account name from Inbox screen, then select the account you want to view.

To create and send emails

- Touch the Ø icon from the Inbox screen.
- Enter recipient(s)'s email address in the To field, and if necessary, touch
 v to add a copy or a blind copy to the message.

- Enter the subject and the content of the message.
- Touch and select Attach picture or Attach video to add an attachment.
- Finally, touch the >> icon to send.
- If you do not want to send the mail out right away, you can touch and then Save draft or touch the Back key to save a copy. To view the draft, touch your account name to display all labels, then select Drafts.

If you do not want to send or save the mail, you can touch \blacksquare and then touch Discard.

To add a signature to emails, touch \blacksquare and then touch **Settings** from the inbox screen, choose an account, then touch **Signature**.

To receive and read your emails

When a new email arrives, you will be notified by a ringtone or vibration, and a \bowtie icon will appear on the Status bar.

Touch and drag down the Status bar to display the Notification panel, touch the new email to view it. Or you can also access the Gmail Inbox label and touch the new mail to read it.

You can search for an email by sender, recipient, subject, etc.

- Touch 🖳 from the top right of the screen.
- Enter the keyword you want to search for in the search box and touch on the software keyboard.

To reply or forward emails

Reply When viewing an email, touch storeply to this mail.
 Reply all Touch and select Reply all to send a messages to all people in a mail loop.
 Forward Touch and select Forward to forward the received mail to other people.

Managing Gmails by Labels

To conveniently manage conversations and messages, you can organise them using a Label. $% \left({{{\left[{{{{\bf{n}}_{\rm{s}}}} \right]}_{\rm{s}}}} \right)$

To label a conversation when reading a conversation's messages, touch and **Change labels** to assign a label for the conversation.

To view conversations by labels when viewing your inbox or another conversation list, touch your account name, then touch a label to view a list of conversations within that label.

To manage labels, touch \blacksquare and Settings, then touch your account and select Manage labels.

Touch and hold a message thread to display the following options:

Touch to archive the email message.

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Touch to delete the email message.

Touch to mark an email message as read or unread.

Touch to open further options, like: Move to, Change labels, Mark not important, Mute, Print, Report spam and Report phishing.

 Add star/ Remove star
 To assign a star or remove the star from the conversation. You can also add or delete a star mark by touching the ☆ or ★ icons at the end of each message thread.

- Mark as (not) To Mark the email as important or not important. important
- Mute To mute the entire conversation. When muted, new mails related to this conversation will not be displayed in the **Inbox**, but archived.
- **Report spam** To report the email message/conversation as spam.
- Report phishing To report the email message/conversation as phishing.

- Touch to mark the checkbox to zoom in/ out of the message, so that it fits on the screen.

Touch to select which screen to show after you delete or archive a conversation.

Mark the checkbox to request confirmation before deleting emails.

Mark the checkbox to request confirmation before archiving emails.

Mark the checkbox to request confirmation before sending emails.

After touching an account, the following settings will appear:

- Notifications Mark the checkbox to activate notification when a new email arrives.

- Days of mail to Touch to set the duration in days for mail sync. sync
- Manage labels Touch to open the Label screen, where you can manage synchronisation and notifications.
- Download Mark the checkbox to auto download attachments to recent messages via Wi-Fi.

Besides your Gmail account, you can also set up external POP3 or IMAP email accounts in your phone.

To access this function, touch the Application tab from the Home screen, then select $\ensuremath{\textbf{Email}}$

An email wizard will guide you through the steps to set up an email account.

• Enter the email address and password of the account you want to set up.

- Touch Next. If the account you entered is not provided by your service provider in the phone, you will be prompted to go to the email account settings screen to enter settings manually. Alternatively, you can touch Manual setup to directly enter the incoming and outgoing settings for the email account you are setting up.
- Enter the account name and display name in outgoing emails.
- To add another email account, you can touch
 and Settings, and finally
 touch ADD ACCOUNT on the right of the title to create the account.

To create and send emails

- Touch the 🧷 icon from the Inbox screen.
- Enter recipient(s) email address(es) in the To field.
- If necessary, touch \square and touch Add Cc/Bcc to add a copy or a blind carbon copy to the message.
- Enter the subject and the content of the message.
- Touch
 , touch Attach file to add an attachment.
- Finally, touch \triangleright to send.
- If you do not want to send the mail right away, you can touch
 and Save draft or touch the Back key to save a copy.

Google's instant messaging service, Hangouts, lets you communicate with your friends whenever they are connected to this service.

To access this feature and sign in, touch the Application tab from the Home screen, then touch **Hangouts**. All friends added by using Hangouts from the web or phone will be displayed in your friends list.

4.3.1 Chatting with your friends

To start a chat, touch the name of a friend in your Friends list, then type your message and finally touch \ge .

You can invite other friends to join in a group chat by touching \square and selecting New group conversation on the group chat screen and then selecting the friend you want to add.

4.3.2 To add a new friend

From the Friends list, touch the + icon to add a new friend. Type the name, email or number of the friend you want to add, and then touch Message or Video call to start a chat.

A notification of this invitation will be received by the friend. By touching the invitation, the friend can select **Decline** or **Reply** in response.

4.3.3 To manage your friends

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Besides adding new friends to your friends list, touching and selecting People & options from your Chatting screen will make the following actions available:



5 Calendar & Alarm clock & Calculator.....

Use the Calendar to keep track of important meetings, appointments, etc.

To access this function, touch the Application tab from the Home screen, then touch ${\bf Calendar}.$

5.1.1 Multimode view



You can display the Calendar in weekly, monthly, or agenda view.

5.1.2 To create new events

You can add new events from any Calendar view.

- Touch the + icon to access the new event edit screen.
- Fill in all required information for this new event. If it is a whole-day event, you can select **All day**.
- When finished, touch **DONE** from the top of the screen.

To quickly create an event from the Week view screen, touch and hold an empty spot or an event to open the Option menu, then touch **New event** to edit the event details.

5.1.3 To delete or edit an event

To share, delete or edit an event, touch the event to enter the details screen, touch the \checkmark icon to share the event with other people by Bluetooth, Email and messaging, etc., touch the \checkmark icon to edit the event, and touch the \checkmark icon to delete.

5.1.4 Event reminder

If a reminder is set for an event, the upcoming event icon $\mathbf{1}$ will appear on the Status bar as a notification when the reminder time arrives.

Touch and drag down the status bar to open the Notification panel, touch the event name to view the Calendar notification list.

Touch **Snooze** to turn off all event reminders for 5 minutes.

Touch the ${\bf Back}$ key to keep the reminders pending in the status bar and the Notification panel.

Important options activated by touching \Box from the Calendar main screen:

• Search	To search in the calendar.
Refresh	To refresh the calendar.
• Calendars to display	To show or hide, remove or add calendars.
Clear events	To clear events in the calendar.
• Go to	Select to go to a specific date.
• Settings	To set a series of Calendar settings.

5.2 Time.....

Your mobile phone has a built-in clock.

To access this function, touch the Application tab from the Home screen, then touch $\ensuremath{\text{Time.}}$

Touch 💽 Alarm to add or set an alarm.

5.2.1 To set an alarm

From the **Time** screen, touch it to enter the **Alarm** screen, touch to add a new alarm. The following options will appear:

- Label Touch to set a name for the alarm.
- Repeat Touch to select days when you want the alarm to work.
- Volume Slide left or right to adjust the alarm volume.
- Vibrate Mark the checkbox to activate vibration.
- Ringtone Touch to select a ringtone for the alarm.
- Time Scroll up or down to select the time for your alarm.

Slide **main** right and left to turn off/on the alarm.

Touch 🛅 to delete the selected alarm.

5.2.2 To adjust alarm settings

Touch of from the **Alarm** screen. The following options will be available:

- Alarm in silent Make the checkbox to play alarm even when the phone is in silent mode.
- Snooze duration Touch to set up the length of snooze.
- Volume buttons Touch to set the desired behaviour of the buttons when pressed during an alarm.

With the Calculator, you can solve many mathematical problems.

To access this function, touch the Application tab from the Home screen, then touch **Calculator**.

There are two panels available: Basic calculator and Scientific calculator.

To switch between panels, touch \Box from the basic panel to open the option menu and touch **Scientific calculator**; or under auto rotation mode, rotate screen automatically to switch between Basic calculator and Scientific calculator.

Enter a number and the arithmetic operation to be performed, enter the second number, then touch "=" to display the result. Touch to delete digits one by one, touch to delete all at one time.

When some numbers or operations have been entered, touch and hold the enter bar to open a menu offering further operations:

- Cut To cut selected text.
- Copy To copy selected text.
- **Paste**⁽¹⁾ To paste what you have previously copied to the entering bar.

To connect to the internet with this phone, you can use GPRS/EDGE/3G networks or Wi-Fi, whichever is most convenient.

6.I Connecting to the Internet

6.I.I GPRS/EDGE/3G

You can touch \blacksquare on the Quick settings bar to connect to the network.

To check the network connection you are using, touch the Application tab on the Home screen, then touch **Settings\More...\Mobile networks\ Access Point Names** or **Network operators**.

To create a new access point

A new GPRS/EDGE/3G network connection can be added to your phone with the following steps:

- Touch 🔯 on the Quick settings bar to get to Settings.
- Touch More...\Mobile networks\Access Point Names
- Then touch 🗆 and select New APN.
- · Enter the required APN information.
- When finished, touch 🗆 and **Save**.

⁽¹⁾ Option will not appear unless copy or cut operation has been made.

To activate/deactivate Data roaming

When roaming, you can decide to connect/disconnect a data service.

- Touch 🙆 on the Quick settings bar to get to Settings.
- Touch Settings->SIM management.
- Touch the switch **o** beside the operator name to activate or deactivate data roaming.
- When Data roaming is deactivated, you can still perform data exchange with a Wi-Fi connection (refer to "6.1.2 Wi-Fi").

6.1.2 Wi-Fi

Using Wi-Fi, you can connect to the Internet when your phone is within range of a wireless network. Wi-Fi can be used on your phone even without a SIM card inserted.

To turn Wi-Fi on and connect to a wireless network

- Touch on the Quick settings bar to get to Settings.
- Touch the O switch beside Wi-Fi to turn on/off Wi-Fi.
- Touch Wi-Fi, the detailed information of detected Wi-Fi networks is displayed in the Wi-Fi networks section.
- Touch a Wi-Fi network to connect with. If the network you selected is secured, you are required to enter a password or other credentials (contact your network operator for details). When finished, touch **Connect**.

To activate notification when a new network is detected

When Wi-Fi is on and the network notification is activated, the Wi-Fi icon will appear on the status bar whenever the phone detects an available wireless network within range. The following steps activate the notification function when Wi-Fi is on:

- Touch 🔯 on the Quick settings bar to get to **Settings**.
- Touch Wi-Fi, then 🗌 and select Advanced.
- Mark/Unmark the Network notification checkbox to activate/ deactivate this function.

To add a Wi-Fi network

When Wi-Fi is on, you may add new Wi-Fi networks according to your preference.

- Touch O on the Quick settings bar to get to **Settings**.
- Touch **Wi-Fi**, and then touch +.
- Enter the name of the network and any required network information.
- Touch Save.

When successfully connected, your phone will be connected automatically the next time you are within range of this network.

To forget a Wi-Fi network

The following steps prevent automatic connections to networks which you no longer wish to use.

- Turn on Wi-Fi, if it's not already on.
- In the Wi-Fi screen, touch and hold the name of the saved network.
- Touch Forget network in the dialog that opens.

Browser.....

Using the Browser, you can enjoy surfing the Web.

To get onto the Web, go to the Home screen and touch the Browser \circledast icon in the Favourites tray.

To go to a web page

On the Browser screen, touch the URL bar at the top and enter the address of the web page by touching \mathbf{Q} .



Touch to delete all contents Touch to search and go to this address Touch to go the suggested website

The URL bar will hide after a few seconds. To show the URL bar, you can touch and slide down the screen.

To set a home page

- Touch \Box from the Browser screen to display the option menu, touch **Settings\General\Set home page**.
- Choose a page or most visited website as your home page.
- If you choose **Other**, enter the URL of the website you want to set as your home page, touch **OK** to confirm.

6.2.1 Viewing web pages

After opening a website, you can navigate on web pages by sliding your finger on the screen in any direction to locate the information you want to view.

To zoom in/out of a web page

Pinch/Spread your finger on the screen to zoom out/in of the web page.

To quickly zoom into a section of a web page, double touch on the section you want to view. To return to normal zoom level, double touch again.

To find text on a web page

- Touch \square from the web page screen, then touch **Find on page**.
- Enter the text or phrase you want to find.
- The first word with matching characters will be highlighted on the screen, and subsequent matches will be boxed.
- Touch the up or down arrow to switch to the previous or next matching items.
- \bullet When finished, you can touch \checkmark or the Back key to close the search bar.

Further operations for the text on a web page

You can copy, share or search the text on a web page:

- Touch and hold the text to highlight it.
- Move the two selecting tabs in orange to locate the text. Or touch **SELECT ALL** iii icon to select all words in this web page.
- Hold and touch the selected text, Copy [c], Share <, Find and Web Search Q_{s} will appear on the screen.
- When finished, touch \checkmark or the **Back** key to deactivate the mode.

To open new window/switch between windows

Multiple windows can be opened at the same time for your convenience.

- Slide up and down to view all windows, touch one to view it.
- Touch 🕂 to open a new window.
- To close a window, touch \bigotimes on the window you want to close or slide it sideways.

- Share page To share the current page with your friends via various ways, like Message, Email, Bluetooth, etc.
- Find on page To input contents you want to find on the current page.
- Request To enable/disable computer versions of websites. desktop site
- Bookmarks/ To see your bookmarks and browsing history. History
- Settings To access a series of Browser settings.
- Version To see the version of your browser.

6.2.2 Manage links, history, downloads

To manage a link, phone number or address displayed on a web page

- Link Touch the link to open the web page. Touch and hold the link to open options for selecting, cutting, coping, and sharing link URL, etc.
- Phone number Touch to call the phone number.
- Address
 Touch to open Google Maps and locate the address.

To view Browser history

- Touch 🔀 from the Browser screen.
- Touch the **History** tab to view browser history.
- Touch Saved pages to view the pages you saved.

To download a web application/view your downloads

Before downloading a web application, you need to enable your phone to install web applications (touch the Application tab from the Home screen, touch **Settings\Security**, mark the checkbox of **Unknown sources**, finally touch **OK** to confirm).

To download an item, touch the item or the link you want to download.

To cancel a download, touch the downloaded item from the Notification panel, touch and hold the item to be deleted, and touch $\frac{1}{2}$ to confirm.

To view items you have downloaded, touch the Application tab, then touch **Downloads**.

Manage bookmarks

To bookmark a web page

- Open the web page you want to bookmark.
- Touch \square and touch **Save to bookmarks**, or from the **History** screen, touch the star beside the URL
- Enter the name and the location if needed and touch **OK** to confirm

To open a bookmark

- Touch 🖂 and touch Bookmarks/History, or touch the 🛐 icon to enter the Bookmarks screen
- Touch the bookmark you want to open.
- You can also touch and hold to display the options screen, then touch Open or Open in new window.

Touch and hold a bookmark in the bookmark list to view additional options:

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6.3 Connecting to Bluetooth devices ⁽¹⁾

Bluetooth is a short-range wireless communication technology that you can use to exchange data, or connect to other Bluetooth devices for various uses.

To access this function, touch O on the Quick settings bar to get to **Settings**, then touch **Bluetooth**. Your device and other available ones will show on the screen.

To turn on Bluetooth

- Touch 🙆 on the Quick settings bar to get to **Settings**.
- Touch O to activate/deactivate this function.

To make your phone more recognisable, you can change your phone name which is visible to others.

- Touch Bluetooth.
- Touch 🗌 and enter a name, and touch **Rename** to confirm.

To make device visible

- Touch 🙆 on the Quick settings bar to get to Settings.
- Touch Bluetooth.
- Touch your device to make it visible or invisible.
- Touch 🗆 and select **Visibility timeout** to select the visible time.

To pair/connect your phone with a Bluetooth device

To exchange data with another device, you need to turn Bluetooth on and pair your phone with the Bluetooth device with which you want to exchange data.

- Touch 🔯 on the Quick settings bar to get to Settings.
- Touch **Bluetooth** and turn it on.
- Touch a Bluetooth device you want to be paired with in the list.
- A dialog will pop up, touch **Pair** to confirm.
- If the pairing is successful, your phone will connect with the device.

To disconnect/unpair from a Bluetooth device

- Touch the Settings icon 📑 beside the device you want to unpair.
- Touch Unpair to confirm.

6.4 Connecting to a computer

With the USB cable, you can transfer media files and other files between micro SD card/internal storage and a computer.

Before using MTP or PTP, first mark **USB debugging**.

 To access this function, touch Settings\About phone, then touch Build number 7 times. Then touch Settings\Developer options\ USB debugging.

(I) You are recommended to use ALCATEL ONETOUCH Bluetooth headsets, which have been tested and proved compatible with your phone. You can go to www.alcatelonetouch.com for more information about the ALCATEL ONETOUCH Bluetooth headset.

To connect/disconnect your phone to/from the computer:

- Use the USB cable that came with your phone to connect the phone to a USB port on your computer. You will receive a notification that the USB is connected.
- If you use mass storage, open the Notification panel and touch USB connected, then touch Mount in the dialog that opens to confirm that you want to transfer files.
- If you use MTP or PTP, your phone will be automatically connected.

To disconnect (from mass storage):

- Unmount the microSD card on your computer.
- Open the Notification panel and touch Turn off.



For Windows XP or lower operating systems, you should download and install Windows Media Player 11 on your computer from the following link: http://windows.microsoft.com/en-us/windows/ windows-media-player.

To locate the data you have transferred or downloaded to the internal storage:

- Touch the Application tab from the Home screen to open the applications list.
- Touch File Manager.

All data you have downloaded is stored in **File Manager**, where you can view media files (videos, photos, music and others), rename files, install applications on your phone, etc.

To format a microSD card

- Touch 🔯 on the Quick settings bar to get to **Settings**.
- Touch Storage.
- Touch **Format SD card**, a popup message appears to warn you that formatting the microSD card will erase its contents.
- Touch Format SD card to confirm.

6.5 Sharing your phone's mobile data connection

You can share your phone's mobile data connection with a single computer via a USB cable (USB tethering) or with up to eight devices at once by turning your phone into a portable Wi-Fi hotspot.

To share your phone's data connection via USB

Use the USB cable that came along with your phone to connect the phone to a USB port on your computer.

- Touch More...\Tethering & portable hotspot.
- Mark\unmark the checkbox of **USB tethering** to activate/deactivate this function.

To share your phone's data connection as a portable Wi-Fi hotspot

- Drag down the Notification panel and touch $\stackrel{\circ}{\leftrightarrow}$ then the Settings icon O to access **Settings**.
- Touch More...\Tethering & portable hotspot.
- Touch the switch o beside **Wi-Fi hotspot** to activate/deactivate this function.

To rename or secure your portable hotspot

When Portable Wi-Fi hotspot is activated, you can change the name of your phone's Wi-Fi network (SSID) and secure its Wi-Fi network.

- Drag down the Notification panel and touch $\stackrel{a**}{\leftrightarrow}$ then the Settings icon O to access **Settings**.
- Touch More...\Tethering & portable hotspot\Wi-Fi hotspot.
- Touch Set up Wi-Fi hotspot to change the network SSID or set your network security.
- Touch Save.

6.6 Connecting to virtual private networks

Virtual private networks (VPNs) allow you to connect to the resources inside a secured local network from outside that network. VPNs are commonly deployed by corporations, schools, and other institutions so that their users can access local network resources when not inside that network, or when connected to a wireless network.

To add a VPN

- Touch 🙆 on the Quick settings bar to get to Settings.
- Touch More...\VPN settings and then touch +.
- In the screen that opens, follow the instructions from your network administrator to configure each component of the VPN settings.
- Touch Save.

The VPN is added to the list on the VPN settings screen.



Before adding a VPN, you should set a lock screen pattern, PIN code or password for your phone.

To connect/disconnect to a VPN

To connect to a VPN:

- Touch 🙆 on the Quick settings bar to get to **Settings**.
- Touch More....\VPN settings.
- \bullet VPNs you have added are listed; touch the VPN you want to connect with.
- In the dialog that opens, enter any requested credentials and touch Connect.

To disconnect:

• Open the Notification panel and touch the resulting notification for VPN disconnection.

To edit/delete a VPN

To edit a VPN:

- Touch O on the Quick settings bar to get to **Settings**.
- Touch More...\VPN settings.
- VPNs you have added are listed; Touch and hold the VPN you want to edit.
- Touch Edit profile.
- After finishing, touch Save.

To delete:

• Touch and hold the VPN you want to delete, in the dialog that opens, touch **Delete profile**.

7 Google Play Store ⁽¹⁾......

Google Play Store is an online software store, where you can download and install applications and games to your Android powered phone.

To open Google Play Store:

- Touch the Application tab from the Home screen, then touch Play Store.
- For the first time you access Google Play Store, a screen with Terms of Service pops up for your attention, touch **Accept** to continue.

Touch and then select **Help** to enter the Google Play Store help page for more information on this function.

7.1 Locate the item you want to download and install

Google Play Store home page provides several ways to find applications. It showcases applications and games in categorised listings.

Touch the top left corner and select My apps to see all your downloads.



Touch a category to browse its contents. You can also select a subcategory if there is one.



Touch **Back** key to return to the previous screen.

7.2 Download and install

To download and install:

- Navigate to the item you want to download, and enter the details screen from which you can read its description, overall rating or comments, view developer's information, etc.
- Touch INSTALL to preview the functions and data the application can access on your phone if you install it.
- Touch ACCEPT to download.
- The progress of the download will show on the details screen, touch X to stop downloading the item. You can also access this screen through the Notification panel.
- After download and installation have finished, you will see a notification icon on the status bar.



Be especially cautious with applications that have access to many functions or to a significant amount of your data. Once you accept, you are responsible for the results of using this item on your phone.

To open the application you have downloaded:

- Touch the top left corner and select My apps.
- Touch the installed application in the list, then touch **OPEN**.

To buy an application ⁽¹⁾

On **Google Play Store**, some applications are labelled as free, while some of them are to be paid for before downloading and installing.

- Touch the application you want to buy.
- Touch the price to preview the functions and data the application can access on your phone if you install it.
- Touch **Continue** to confirm.
- When making your first purchase, you are required to input your credit card information and to log into the Google payment and billing service.
- If your account has multiple credit card accounts, select one to proceed.
- Select the Terms of Service link and read the document. When finished, touch the **Back** key.
- Mark the checkbox if you agree with the Terms of Service.
- Touch **Buy now** at the bottom of the screen.

When finished, Android downloads the application.

To request a refund

If you are not satisfied with the application, you can ask for a refund within 15 minutes of the purchase. Your credit card will not be charged and the application will be removed. If you change your mind, you can install the application again, but you will not be able to request a refund.

- Touch the and touch **My apps** from the Google Play Store Apps screen.
- Touch the application that you want to uninstall and refund.
- Touch **REFUND** to uninstall the application and receive a refund. If the button becomes **UNINSTALL**, your trial period has expired.
- \bullet In the survey form, select the answer that best matches your reason, and touch OK.

7.3 Manage your downloads

After you have downloaded and installed an application, the following further operations are available for your selection.

View

On the Google Play Store Apps screen, touch the top left corner and touch **My apps**.

Uninstall

On the Google Play Store Apps screen, touch the top left corner and touch **My apps**. Touch the application you want to uninstall to enter the details screen, touch **UNINSTALL**, and finally touch **OK** to confirm.

Refund

On the Google Play Store Apps screen, touch the top left corner and touch **My apps**. Touch the application you want to uninstall for a refund, touch **REFUND**, and finally touch **OK** to confirm.

Update notification

On the Google Play Store Apps screen, touch \blacksquare and touch **Settings Notifications** to enable update notification.

Rate and review

Open the details screen for an application, touch the stars besides **Rate & review** to award and input comments, touch **SUBMIT** to confirm.

Flag


You can report an inappropriate application to Google Play Store by flagging it. Open the details screen for the application, scroll to the bottom and touch **Flag as inappropriate**, enter the reason and finally touch **Submit**.

8 Multimedia applications......

Your mobile phone is fitted with a Camera for taking photos and shooting videos.

Before using the Camera, be sure to open the protective lens cover to avoid it affecting your picture quality.

To take a photo when your phone is active, touch the Camera o icon in the Favourites tray on your Home screen.



To take a picture

The screen acts as the viewfinder. First position the object or landscape in the viewfinder, touch the o icon to take the picture which will then be automatically saved.

To shoot a video

First position the object or landscape in the viewfinder, and touch the 🗖 icon to start recording. Touch up to pause recording, touch up or press the Back key to save the video.

8.1.1 Settings in framing mode

Before taking a photo/shooting a video, touch the O icon to adjust a number of settings in framing mode.



• HDR	Touch to activate high-dynamic range.
• Panorama	Touch to switch to panorama mode.
• Night	Touch to switch to night mode.
• QR Scan	Touch to scan the QR code.
• Filter	Touch to choose your favourite style to capture scenes.
• Face detection	Touch to activate/deactivate face detection.
Shutter sound	Touch to turn on/off shutter sound.
• GPS location info	Touch to display GPS location information.
Advanced	Touch to show series of advanced options: picture size, timer and exposure.

8.2 Gallery

The Gallery acts as a media player for you to view photos and playback videos. In addition, a set of further operations to pictures and videos are available for your choice.

To access this function, touch the Application tab from the Home screen, then touch Gallery.



To view a picture/play a video

Pictures and videos are displayed by albums in the Gallery.

- Touch an album and all pictures or videos will display on the screen.
- Touch the picture/video directly to view or play it.
- Slide left/right to view previous or next pictures/videos.

Working with pictures

You can work with pictures by editing them, sharing them with friends, setting them as a contact photo or wallpaper, etc.

Locate the picture you want to work on, touch the picture from full-screen picture view. Slide the icon bar below left and right to select one, touch the \Rightarrow icon to share the picture, touch the \overline{iii} icon above and confirm **OK** to delete the picture.

Touch $\overset{*}{\mbox{\tiny \sc s}}$ from full-screen picture view, picture details will be available for your view.



Touch to share the picture through selected apps Touch to edit the picture: **Beauty**, **Enhance**, **Effects**, **Frame**, **Mosaics**, etc.

Touch to set the picture as contact photo or wallpaper

Touch to play the slideshow

Touch \swarrow from the full-screen picture view. More options will display for you to choose from.



- Touch to go back to the picture display screen.
- 2 Touch to undo the previous modification.
- 6 Touch to redo the previous modification.
- O Touch to save the modified picture.

Batch operation

The Gallery provides a multi-select function, so that you can work with pictures/videos in batches.

Open the main Gallery window or an album, touch \Box and select **Select album** to activate batch operation mode (you can also touch and hold one album/picture), then touch albums/pictures you want to work on. Touch the \Box icon to delete selected ones. Touch select to share selected ones.

8.3 YouTube

YouTube is an online video-sharing service where the user can download, share and view videos. It supports a streaming function that allows you to start watching videos almost as soon as they begin downloading from the Internet.

To access this function, touch the Application tab from the Home screen, then touch **YouTube**.



As an online video service, your phone must have a network connection to access YouTube.

All videos in YouTube are grouped into several categories, like Most Popular, Most Discussed, Featured Videos, etc.

8.3.1 Watch videos

Touch a video to play it. In the Playing screen, you can view information and video comments, and also browse links to related videos. You can also rate, share, label as favourite, create a new playlist, etc. from this screen.

To exit the video playing screen, touch the ${\color{black}}$ key to return to the video list.

8.4 Music

You can play music files stored on the microSD card or phone. Music files can be downloaded from a computer to the microSD card using a USB cable.

To play your music, touch the Application tab from the Home screen, then touch **Music**.

You will find eight categories in which all songs are classified: **ALL**, **Favourite**, **Folder**, **Artist**, **Album**, **Genre**, **Recent add and Playlist**. Slide left and right to view all. Select a category to play songs, touch \square and touch **Shuffle all** to shuffle all songs.

For details about You Tube features, visit the YouTube website: www.YouTube.com

8.4.1 Playing music

Touch a song or touch **Play** from the drop-down menu to play it.



- Touch to play the current playlist in shuffle mode (tracks are played in random order).
- 2 Touch to skip to the previous track in the album, playlist, or shuffle.
- 6 Touch to pause/resume playback.
- **O** Touch to skip to the next track in the album, playlist, or shuffle.
- S Touch to select repeat mode: Repeating all songs, Repeating current song, or Repeat is off.
- O Touch to add the now-playing song to favourite.
- Touch to show the displayed song.



While playing songs with Music, the operation of pause, play or skip is still available even if the screen is locked.

Adjust sound effects

Touch \square and touch **Sound effects** from the playing screen to enable and adjust sound effects.

8.4.2 Working with playlists

Playlists allow you to conveniently organise all songs .

You can create a new playlist, add a song to the list, and delete or rename a playlist.

To create a playlist

Touch **Playlist** from the Playlists screen, touch \blacksquare and enter the name and finally touch **Save**.

To delete a playlist

Touch and hold a playlist to show the menu, then touch **Delete**.

To rename a playlist

Touch and hold a playlist to show the menu, then touch **Rename**. When finished, touch **Save** to confirm.

8.5 Video Player

To play a video, touch the Application tab from the Home screen, then touch $\ensuremath{\textbf{Video}}.$

Video is a small built-in video player that lists all your videos.

Touch an item from the list to play. While playing, touch a point on the timeline to jump to and play from.

9 Google Maps⁽¹⁾......

9.1 Get My Location

9.1.1 Choose a data source to decide My Location

Touch O on the Quick settings bar to get to **Settings**, touch **Location** services.

Mark the checkbox of **Access to my location**, then the **O** Switch beside GPS satellites will be automatically on to set GPS as the My location data source.

Alternatively, mark the checkbox of **Google's location service** to set Wi-Fi and/or mobile networks as My Location data source.

9.1.2 Open Google Maps and view My Location

Touch the Application tab from the Home screen, then touch **Maps**.

Touch the **v** icon on the map to view **My Location**.

The map will then centre on a blue dot. Your actual position is at the blue dot.



To move the map, drag the map with your finger.


To zoom in and out of a map, pinch or spread your fingers, or you can also zoom in by double-tapping a location on screen.

9.2 Search for a location

While viewing a map, touch the $\mathsf{Q}_{\!\!\mathsf{s}}$ search icon to activate the search function.

In the search box, enter an address, a city or a local business.

Touch the search icon to search, and in a while your search results will appear on the map as red dots. You can touch one to show a label.



9.3 Save a location

Just like bookmarking a web address on the Internet, you can star any position on the map for later use.

⁽¹⁾ It may vary depending on the app version of Maps.

9.3.1 How to star (or unstar) a location

Touch a location on a map.

Touch the address rectangle which then opens.

Touch $\stackrel{\star}{\underset{\tiny{\rm ans}}{}}$ to save the location. (Or touch $\stackrel{\star}{\underset{\tiny{\rm ans}}{}}$ to cancel the saving of that location.)

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9.4 Get driving, public transportation or walking directions

9.4.1 Get suggested routes for your trip

Touch the γ icon on the Maps screen.

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- Touch the enter bar to edit your start point by entering an address or selecting a saved item.
- Do the same for your end point.
- To reverse directions, touch **1**.
- Then select a transport mode: driving by car, using public transportation, or walking directions.

9.4.2 Preview suggested routes and decide on a route more preferable or feasible to you

You can preview each turn in your route in Navigation, Satellite, and other views.

- Touch Start to preview your selected route.
- Touch to open Alternate routes, Mute voice guidance, Show/ Hide traffic, or Show/Hide satellite. Touch the Back key to return to the previous view.

When selecting a more preferable or feasible route, distance and time will be the two most important factors for your evaluation. Distance and estimated time will be displayed at the bottom of the directions screen.

9.4.3 Search for locations along your route

Refer to "9.2 Search for a location" for detailed information.

9.5 Arrangement of Layers

Layers allow you to view locations and additional information overlaid on the map. You can add multiple layers or remove only certain layers so you control exactly what information you want visible on the map at one time.

Others.....

10.1 File Manager.....

To access this function, touch the Application tab from the Home screen, then touch **File Manager**.

File Manager works with both SD card and phone storage.

File Manager displays all data stored on both microSD card and phone storage, including applications, media files such as videos, pictures or audios you have captured; other data transferred via Bluetooth, USB cable, etc.

When you download an application from a PC to your microSD card, you can locate the application on File Manager, then touch it to install it in your phone.

File Manager allows you to perform and be really efficient with the following common operations: create a (sub) folder, open a folder/file, view, rename, move, copy, delete, play, share, etc.

10.2 Sound Recorder

To record a sound or voice memo, touch the Application tab from the Home screen, then touch **Sound Recorder.**

Sound Recorder allows you to record voice/sound for seconds/hours.

10.3 Radio

Your phone is equipped with a radio⁽¹⁾. You can use the application as a traditional radio with saved channels or with parallel visual information related to the radio programme on the display if you tune to stations that offer a visual radio service.

To listen to the radio, touch the Application tab from the Home screen, then touch $\ensuremath{\textbf{Radio}}$



To use it, you must plug in your headset, which works as an antenna connected with your phone.

10.4 Setup Wizard 123

To access this function, touch the Application tab from the Home screen, then touch ${\bf Setup Wizard}.$

Setup Wizard helps set up your phone in multiple ways: language, input method, mobile data connection, account setup and synchronisation, etc. This will also be performed the first time you power on your phone.

10.5 Other applications ⁽¹⁾.....

The previous applications in this section are preinstalled on your phone. To read a brief introduction of the preinstalled 3rd party applications, refer to the leaflet provided with the phone. You can also download thousands of 3rd party applications by going to Google Play Store on your phone.

II.I.I SIM Management (1)

The SIM management option only exists under Dual SIM status.

Touch to edit SIM name, set background colour and display numbers.

Touch to select SIM for voice calls, video calls, messaging and data connection.

GENERAL SETTINGS

Roaming

Touch to turn on/off data roaming and show roaming reminder.

• Contacts & SIM

Select to associate contacts with a specific SIM.

11.1.2 Wi-Fi

Using Wi-Fi you can now surf the Internet without using your SIM card whenever you are in range of a wireless network. The only thing you have to do is to enter the **Wi-Fi** screen and configure an access point to connect your phone to the wireless network.

For detailed instructions on using Wi-Fi, please refer to "6.1.2 Wi-Fi".

II.I.3 Bluetooth

Bluetooth allows your phone to exchange data (videos, images, music, etc.) within a small range with another Bluetooth supported device (phone, computer, printer, headset, car kit, etc.).

For more information on Bluetooth, please refer to "6.3 Connecting to Bluetooth devices".

II.I.4 Call settings

Call settings allows you to set the voice call, video call, and other related settings.

You can refer to "3.1.6 Call settings" for more information.

II.I.5 Data usage

To enable/disable mobile data, touch the **O** switch after selecting your mobile operator on the right of **OVERVIEW**.

By marking the checkbox of **Set mobile data limit**, you can then drag the limit line and the warning line according to your preferred limits. Your mobile data connection will be disabled when the specified limit is reached. You can also choose a data usage cycle to view the statistics and related applications of your phone's data use.

Touch \Box , and you can view more settings related to your data usage.

Data usage is measured by your phone, and your operator may count differently. Consider using a conservative limit.

11.1.6 Aeroplane mode

Through **More...\Aeroplane mode** you can simultaneously disable all wireless connections including Wi-Fi, Bluetooth and more.

You can also open Aeroplane mode by touching **AEROPLANE MODE** on the Quick settings bar or in phone options when you press the **Power** key.

II.I.7 Default SMS app

Choose default app for SMS functions.

11.1.8 Tethering & portable hotspot

This function allows you to share your phone's mobile data connection via USB or as a portable Wi-Fi access point (Please refer to "6.5 Sharing your phone's mobile data connection").

II.I.9 VPN settings

A mobile virtual private network (mobile VPN or mVPN) provides mobile devices with access to network resources and software applications on their home network, when they connect via other wireless or wired networks. Mobile VPNs are used in environments where workers need to keep application sessions open at all times, throughout the working day, as the user connects via various wireless networks, encounters gaps in coverage, or suspends-and-resumes their device to preserve battery life. A conventional VPN can't survive such events because the network tunnel is disrupted, causing applications to disconnect, time out, fail, or even the computing device itself to crash.

For more information on VPN, please refer to "6.6 Connecting to virtual private networks".

Touch to turn on/off data connection.

Touch to turn on/ off 3G service and select the network mode.

Touch to view/edit/delete preferences.

Mark the checkbox to share your PC internet via a USB cable when connected to PC.

II.2 Device

II.2.I Gestures

Mark the checkbox to enable the gesture: Shake to switch music.

II.2.2 Sound

Use the Sound settings to configure ringtones for different events and environments.

• Vibrate	Mark the checkbox to activate vibration when receiving incoming calls.
• Silent mode	Mark the checkbox to silence all sounds except media & alarms.
Ringtone	Slide to adjust the volume of ringtones.

11.2.3 Display

- Wallpaper Touch to set the wallpaper.
- Brightness Touch to adjust the brightness of the screen.
- Auto-rotate screen Mark the checkbox to select whether or not the screen rotates automatically.
- Sleep Touch to set the screen timeout.
- Daydream Touch to set the daydream.
- Font size Touch to set the font size.
- 11.2.4 Lock settings
- Select screen lock Touch to choose screen lock.
- Lock options Touch to customise widgets on lock screen.

- Change lock Touch to set wallpaper of lock screen. wallpaper
- Owner information Touch to input owner information which will display on the lock screen.

11.2.5 Status bar

Touch the **O** switch to reveal all 3rd party application notifications which will then be shown on the top left of the status bar.

You can also touch some app icons to deactivate their notifications in the status bar.

11.2.6 Storage

Use these settings to manage your microSD card by monitoring the total and available space on your phone and your microSD card.



If a warning message comes up saying that phone memory is limited, you are required to free up space by deleting some unwanted applications, downloaded files, etc.

11.2.7 Battery management

In the battery screen you can view battery usage data since you last connected the phone to a power source. The screen also shows your battery status and how long it has been used since last charging. Touch one category to reveal its specific power consumption.

You can adjust power use by adjusting screen brightness or screen timeout in the Display screen.

II.2.8 Applications

You use the Applications settings to view details about the applications installed on your phone, to manage their data and force them to stop, and to set whether you want to permit installation of applications that you obtain from websites and emails.

11.3 Personal

II.3.I Location

Check to use your phone's global positioning system (GPS) satellite receiver to pinpoint your location within an accuracy as close as several meters ("street level"). The process of accessing the GPS satellite and setting your phone's precise location for the first time will require up to 5 minutes. You will need to stand in a place with a clear view of the sky and avoid moving. After this, GPS will only need 20-40 seconds to identify your precise location.

11.3.2 Security

Encrypt phone

You can encrypt your accounts, settings, downloaded apps and their data, media and other files by touching Encrypt phone.

Guest mode

Touch to lock applications to protect your privacy.

Find Me Back

Turn on the **o** switch to activate this function. It will protect your privacy in case of theft or loss.

Set up SIM card lock

Choose a SIM card you want to configure.

Mark the checkbox of $\ensuremath{\text{Lock SIM}}$ card to lock the SIM card with a PIN code.

Touch Change SIM PIN to change the PIN code.

Make passwords visible

Mark the checkbox to show passwords as you type.

Device administrators

Touch to view or deactivate device administrators.

Unknown sources

Mark the checkbox to permit installation of applications that you obtain from websites, emails, or other locations other than Google Play Store.

To protect your phone and personal data, download applications only from trusted sources, such as Google Play Store.

Verify apps

Mark the checkbox to prevent or warn you before installing apps which might cause harm.

Mobile anti-theft

Turn on anti-theft function to lock the phone or wipe data remotely in case of theft or loss.

Storage type

Software is the only storage type for credentials.

Trusted credentials

Touch to display trusted CA certificates.

Install from Memory

Touch to install encrypted certificates from the microSD card.

Clear credentials

Touch to clear credential storage of all contents and reset its password.

11.3.3 Language & input

Use the Language & input settings to select the language for the text on your phone and for configuring the onscreen keyboard. You can also configure voice input settings and the pointer speed.

Language

Touch to select the language and the region you want.

Spell checker

Mark the checkbox to enable the system to show suggested words.

User dictionary

Touch to open a list of the words you've added to the dictionary. Touch a word to edit or delete it. Touch the add button (+) to add a word.

Default

Touch to select a default input method. Touch the Settings icon \bigotimes on the right of selected input method, a series of settings are available for your selection.

Android keyboard

The Android keyboard settings apply to the onscreen keyboard that is included with your phone. The correction and capitalisation features affect only the English version of the keyboard. Available options are as follows: Input languages

Touch to set input language.

Auto-capitalisation

Mark the checkbox to have the onscreen keyboard automatically capitalise the first letter of the first word after a period, the first word in a text field, and each word in name fields.

Vibrate on keypress

Mark the checkbox to have the phone vibrate briefly each time you touch a key on the onscreen keyboard.

Sound on keypress

Mark the checkbox to play a brief sound each time you touch a key on the onscreen keyboard.

Popup on keypress

Mark the checkbox to pop up the key that you touched.

Voice input key
